



An Example of How Funds Can Be Used

ILA Scotland provides the learner with up to £500 towards the cost of learning. How the learner chooses to spend these funds is up to them.

ILA Scotland £200 funds can be used as payment for one single course or for several smaller courses throughout the year.

ILA Scotland £500 funds can be used to help pay course fees for a part-time higher education or professional qualification course.

Examples of how ILA Scotland funds can be used are shown below.

ILA 200 example

Joan Smith has £200 in her ILA Scotland account.

In August, she chooses a course that costs £50. She pays £10 to the learning provider and £40 is paid by ILA Scotland.

Joan now has £160 left in her ILA Scotland account.

In October she chooses a course that costs £180. ILA Scotland contributes £160 towards the course and Joan pays the balance of £20 to the learning provider.

ILA 500 example

Bryan Wilson finds a higher education course for £550 he is interested in studying part – time.

He completes the application form and takes it to his college who complete section C. Bryan then returns the completed forms with his evidence of income.

He receives an Award Notification letter advising that his application has been successful and £500 will be contributed towards the cost of his course from ILA Scotland.

Bryan must pay £50 of his own money towards the cost of the course.
