

ILA Scotland

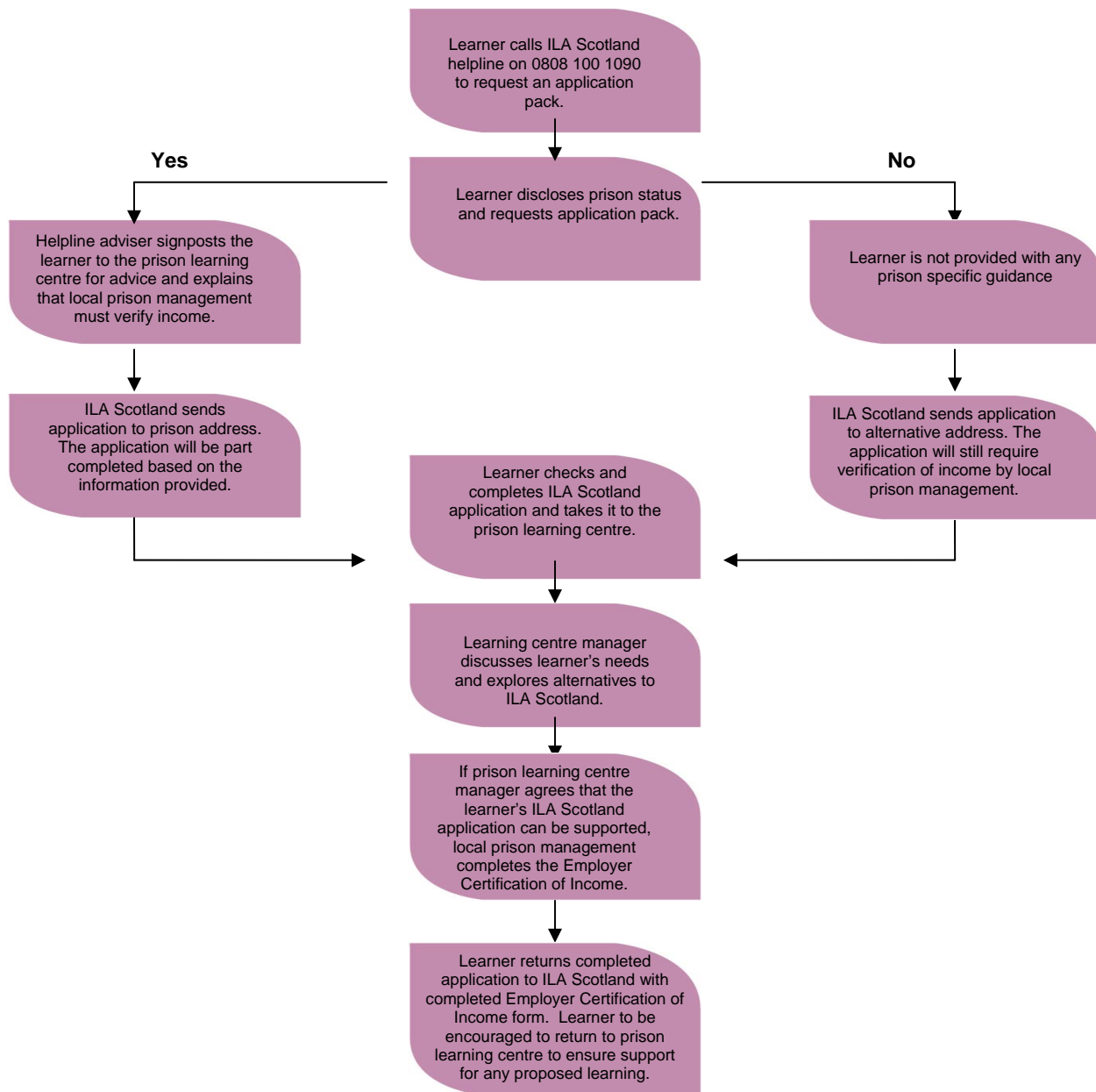
ILA Scotland is a simple way to get up to £200 a year towards the cost of learning. It's a Scottish Executive scheme for anyone over 18 and living in Scotland.

Anyone who earns £15,000 a year or less can apply for an individual learning account that provides up to £200 funding towards approved courses.

To access ILA Scotland funding the applicant must provide evidence of income. For prisoners this will mean requesting that local prison management complete the Employer Certification of Income form which is included in the ILA Scotland application pack.

Note:

- ILA Scotland also provides up to £100 funding towards a range of certificated courses for people earning more than £15,000 a year. Evidence of income is not required to apply for the lower level of funding.
