Thelma applied for a learner account from ILA Scotland and enrolled at her local learning centre.

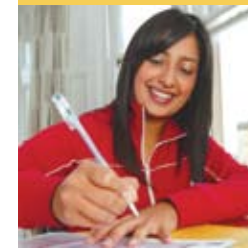
"I would never have been able to afford to do the course without my learner account," added Thelma, who received £200 funding from ILA Scotland.
